The recent AGHA Annual General Meeting concluded with the voting to approve certain matters and with the election of the Board of Directors for the 2021-2022 year. The pandemic made for a challenging AGM and the Board would like to express its gratitude and appreciation to all of the residents of Antrim Glen who took the time and interest to turn out to the information sessions and to participate in the subsequent voting process. Not perfect, but it did get the job done.

There was a large slate of directors to be approved as there were 6 current directors and 3 new nominees competing for the 7 positions on the Board that were open. All 6 current directors that stood for election were approved. In addition, the Board is very pleased to announce the election of Pat Mossman as the Board's ninth director. Pat is well known for her long-standing contributions to the community and should be a strong addition to the Board. In addition to Pat, the returning directors that were approved are Murray Proud, Dave Cooper, Henry Melo, Jo-Anne Lucas, Nancy Clodge and Ross Hayward. Gary Cline and Gary Young, who are already mid-term, round out the 9-person board.

Additionally, the Board would like to thank residents Frank Pal and Carolyn Andrews for putting their names forth as candidates to serve on the Board. The Board appreciates their involvement and looks forward to involving them more into our community going forward.

In addition to voting for board directors, residents approved the session notes from the previous 2020 AGM and the Treasurer's report as of March 31, 2021. Additionally, residents gave the AGHA Board approval to investigate and advise as to the feasibility of installing Pickleball courts here in Antrim Glen. This was far from unanimous (68% voting favourably) so clearly this is a subject to be reviewed carefully and deeply before being presented to the community for approval to move forward. Also, residents showed positive support for the idea of bringing food trucks into the community.

Lastly the Board would like to express its gratitude and appreciation to the election committee – Brian Massier, chair, Brian Bowers and Diane Bangerter – who independently from the Board collected and verified all of the 130 ballots received. In addition to providing the results of the election the committee was able to offer suggestions for improvement for future elections.
